The Practice and Process Studies (PPS) research hub provides a framework for working closely with policy makers, NGOs and industry to drive change and enhance outcomes on macro level societal issues and on organisational issues.

Working for society

Grand societal challenges

- We are studying how organisations, NGOs, governments and societies deal with new societal and critical challenges.
- We are working on disaster resilience for homeowners, sustaining insurance markets in the face of growing disaster, building multidimensional societal resilience to disaster and other social issues such as labour inequality in the gig economy.

Entrepreneurship

- Our research examines the development of the startup ecosystem, with a particular focus on South East Queensland and Australia.
- We follow entrepreneurs in real-time, to analyse how they create startups, what works and what doesn't.

Strategy


• We are helping answer questions such as 'How can organisations and institutuions shape strategic action inside and outside firms, to meet a changing and uncertain environment?'.

Skilful performance

• Our researchers are advancing our understanding of what defines knowing (e.g. capabilities, knowledge, competence) and learning in the skillful performance of individuals, groups and organisations.

Advancing practice and process theory

 We are working to to better understand the philosophical and empirical underpinnings of practice and process theories and extend their boundaries to fields such as strategy-as-practice, entrepreneurship-as-practice, organising-in-practice, routine dynamics and beyond.

She is currently researching climate adaptation and individual and community resilience to extreme weather. Paula is also a Fellow of the Academy of Management, a Fellow of the British Academy and a Fellow of the Acdemy of the Social Sciences of Australia.

Paul is an Associate Professor of strategy and entrepreneurship and is a leading scholar in strategy and qualitative research. His research reflects his passion to identify the relevance of theory in practice and how practice can inform theory.
