#### **RBUS3999 Business Industry Placement**

This course offers students in their final semester the chance to apply their conceptual knowledge in a real-world professional placement. It connects academic learnings and personal employability skills with industry challenges, providing valuable work experience and helping students develop a workplace-ready skill set.

To be considered for enrolment, students must have a grade point average (GPA) of at least 4.0 on UQ's 7-point scale and be in their final semester. RBUS3999 may be counted towards Elective course from outside program.\*
