We aim to develop a theoretical framework for designing effective digital interventions seeking to improve continuity of care, integrated patient data, and enhance service quality in public and private mental healthcare sectors. The outcomes will provide actionable recommendations for building robust, patient-centred mental healthcare systems, ultimately leading to better mental health outcomes nationwide.
