

## Master of Global Management – Incoming students 2026 Double Degree Program Structure

It is important that you read and understand the following information.

This program is restricted **to incoming students from Aalto University, Bocconi University, ESSEC Business School**, and **Queen's University.** You must satisfy the entry requirements as outlined in the program rules. It is your responsibility to ensure that you complete all the requirements of this program to graduate. The following information is designed to help you plan your enrolment to meet this goal.

#### **Program Guidelines:**

You must complete 32 units comprising:

- 6 units for all MGMan Core Courses; and
- 8 units from MGMan Fields of Study; and
- 18 units for MGMan Elective Options

Your study plan may differ depending on your home institution.

#### Partner Institutions

Of the 32 units required for the program, a student must obtain 16 units from completed study at a partner institution. Students will be awarded two master's degree upon completion, one from UQ and one from partner institution.

### Guidelines for completing a research thesis at UQ

Incoming double degree students from **Aalto University** (Semester 2 entry only) and **Bocconi University** (non-coursework pathway) are required to complete an 8-unit research thesis as part of their UQ program. You may choose one of the following thesis options in your second semester:

- IBUS7326 Global Management Thesis C (semester-long thesis, expected graduation July 2026); or
- RBUS7995 Research Thesis (yearlong thesis, expected graduation December 2026)

To undertake a research thesis, you must submit a formal application supported by your proposed Business School academic supervisor, along with a **1,000-word research proposal**. Enrolment in the thesis course is subject to approval by the **Director of Education (or delegate)**.

#### Getting started: topic and supervisor

The first step is to choose a topic and supervisor. Please note:

- Your topic must be relevant to global management or related fields such as business, commerce, management, tourism/events. Economics-based topics may be considered if a suitable supervisor is available.
- For topic inspiration, explore previous student theses (Honours, MPhil, PhD) via <u>UQ eSpace</u>, review
   <u>academic staff profiles</u> on the Business School website, speak with other research students, and
   reflect on your undergraduate coursework. You can also refer to <u>UQ Experts</u> to find a
   business/commerce/economics focussed academic.
- Select a supervisor whose research interests align with your topic. If you're unable to find a suitable match, contact the **Postgraduate Thesis Coordinator** (as of September 2025, <u>Associate Professor Anna Jenkins</u>) for guidance.

#### Thesis and supervisor expectations

The thesis is an **independent research project** with no scheduled classes or timetables. Supervisors guide the process by helping you develop a feasible study plan, providing regular feedback, and supporting your research development. You are expected to:

- Manage your time effectively and follow a realistic work schedule
- Communicate openly with your supervisor and attend scheduled meetings
- Act on feedback and raise any concerns early
- Contact the course coordinator if the supervisory relationship is not working

Early discussions around co-authorship are encouraged to ensure mutual understanding.
