Morning	Cultural event: Yad Vashem – Holocaust Memorial Museum	Visit the memorial to the six million Jewish victims of the Holocaust	
Afternoon	Cultural event: Jerusalem Old City Tour	Visit the church of the Holy Sepulchre then continue to Mt. Zion to see David's Tomb; the room of the Last Supper; and Dormition Abbey. Continue walking through the old city of Jerusalem; see the Western Wall; view the Temple Mount and the Dome of the Rock; walk along Via Dolorosa

Afternoon	Cultural event: Explore Tel Aviv and Old Jaffa	Visit Jaffa to experience a great view of Tel Aviv from the south; walk around the art galleries and the narrow alleys of this ancient city of Neve Zedak – the new 'in' area that used to be the first neighbourhood of the new city – Tel Aviv	
Afternoon	Optional cultural event <i>Students pay individually</i>	 Take a journey through the personal life story of the guide, a son of an Arab family from Jaffa, who had to leave their home due to the 1948 war. The family stayed in refugee camps and was one of the very few that were able to return to Jaffa and rebuild itself This tour is for those who want to hear the Palestinian perspective and get to know the Islamic world
